Motivated, Unified Singing through Individual Commitment (MUSIC!) outlines the expectations of all performing members of The Peninsulaires Chorus. As chorus members, we are all choosing to adopt the following initiatives to work towards achieving our music, performance, and chapter goals.

I, as a member of the Palo Alto–Mountain View Chapter and The Peninsulaires Chorus agree to the following:

- 1. Abide by and support the Barbershop Harmony Society Code of Ethics, Vision and Mission Statements of the PAMV Chapter, and all chapter objectives (see attached).
- I understand that in becoming a member of The Peninsulaires I am accepting a responsibility to the chorus, to my fellow singers, to the directors, to all others who work with the chorus or performances in any capacity, and to the audience for whom I perform.
- 3. I understand that I must respect all others in any capacity, and that I will treat others in a courteous, ethical manner at all times to maintain a positive, trusting, supportive environment, in rehearsal and in performance, onstage and backstage alike.

a. I will be respectfully quiet while others are speaking or rehearsing.

b. I shall respect the songs, the composers, lyricists and arrangers; and remembering that "a work of art is not a work of art until it is finished," I shall not condemn either a song or a performance script while it is in rehearsal.

4. I will do my best to attend every performance and commit to the expected <u>minimum</u> of active participation in 70% of all scheduled chorus performances each calendar year (roughly 8 out of 12). In addition to reporting my availability on the chapter Groupanizer calendar, I will inform my section leader and the director as soon as I know that I will be unable to attend a scheduled performance along with the reason.

- 5. I will also strive to attend every rehearsal, committing myself to at least the absolute <u>minimum</u> of 70% of all scheduled rehearsals (9 Tuesdays per quarter, 36 Tuesdays per year, plus extra rehearsals as called), understanding that falling below the minimum may make me ineligible to participate in specific performances. I will indicate my unavailability to attend any scheduled rehearsals on the chapter Groupanizer calendar except in cases of unexpected last-minute absence.
- 6. I will always arrive on time for performances and do my best to arrive on time for and stay through to the end of all chorus rehearsals.
- 7. I will learn the chorus repertoire according to the time table established for each new song. I understand that failure to maintain and demonstrate in rehearsal my knowledge of the chorus repertoire, both vocal and visual, may result in suspension from public performance until such time as I have demonstrated reasonable command of the material.
- 8. I understand that I must do my best to learn and execute all staging that may be required of me in performances and shows (i.e., song visual plan, entrances/exits, performance script) and I will fulfill any further responsibilities (i.e., wearing costumes and using props) that I may accept during the course of a performance.
- 9. I will spend *at least* 2 hours per week outside of normal chapter meetings practicing the barbershop craft (an average of 20 minutes per day). I further understand that daily practice will provide the best results in building muscle memory and unconscious competence of the songs and performance skills.
- 10. I shall accept my directors' advice and counsel in the spirit in which it is given, for they can see and hear the performance as a whole and my work from the front.
- 11. While I may at appointed times quietly discuss performance issues with my immediate riser neighbors, I will not give unsolicited notes or criticism beyond that boundary, for I am not the director.
- 12. I will deliver every performance with energy and enthusiasm to the best of my ability regardless of the size of the audience, performance venue, or other external issues.
- 13. I will keep my chorus costumes (Class A , Travel, and stage make-up) in full readiness for performances.
- 14. I will follow the logistical necessities of the chapter (wear name badge, bring music, pencil & recorder to every meeting, check pigeon-hole file, check on-line performance schedule [Groupanizer], and be aware of the yearly calendar).
- 15. Since we share our rehearsal space with many groups, I will do my best to keep it looking clean, orderly and attractive regardless of whether I am assigned to such work or not.
